Assistant: Take the number 17 bus from Queen Square bus station. It goes directly to the stadium.

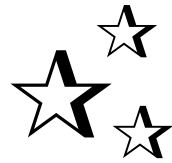

2) Two Beatles houses in Liverpool

Jamie went on a class trip to Liverpool. When he came back, he wrote about it for the school magazine.

The World of THE BEATLES



Last week our class went on a trip to Liverpool. Some of us visited Anfield Stadium. My group went to see two houses ...

If you are a Beatles fan (and there are millions of Beatles fans all over the world, aged from 10 to 100), these two small houses in Liverpool are a 'must see'. Built in the 1930s and 1950s, they don't look special from the outside, but some people have called them the two most important houses in the history of popular music.

The reason is that they are the houses where two of the Beatles – John Lennon and Paul McCartney – lived when they were children. Number 251 Menlove Avenue is the house where John Lennon lived when he was a boy. It was his aunt's, not his parents' house, because John lived with his aunt Mimi from the age of five. In fact he lived there until he was 22. Many years later, John Lennon's wife¹ Yoko Ono bought the house and gave it to the National Trust, an organization that runs houses that tourists can visit. "I wanted to preserve it for Beatles fans all over the world," she said when she bought it. Now you can visit lots of rooms in the house, like the kitchen where John ate his meals, the living room where he played games with his aunt, and, upstairs, the bedroom

where John played the guitar and wrote some of his first songs.

Not far away is 20 Forthlin Road, another very 'normal' brick house where Paul McCartney lived with his parents and his younger brother Michael. Paul was living here when his mother died in 1956: Paul was only 16 years old. You can go and see most rooms in the house, and you can see Michael's photos of the McCartney family on the walls. It's amazing to think that this is where John and Paul wrote many of their songs!

As the two houses are quite small, you can only visit them in groups of fifteen people. For this reason, you have to book your tour online, or you can call the National Trust on 0151 427 7231. You can't just call at the house and go inside. Each tour lasts about two and half hours and costs £20 for adults, or £6 for children. You travel from one house to the other in a minibus, and a guide² explains everything and tells you stories about when John and Paul were children. The guide is of course happy to answer any questions you may have. The tours run from Wednesday to Sunday, starting at 10 am, 11 am and 2.15 pm.

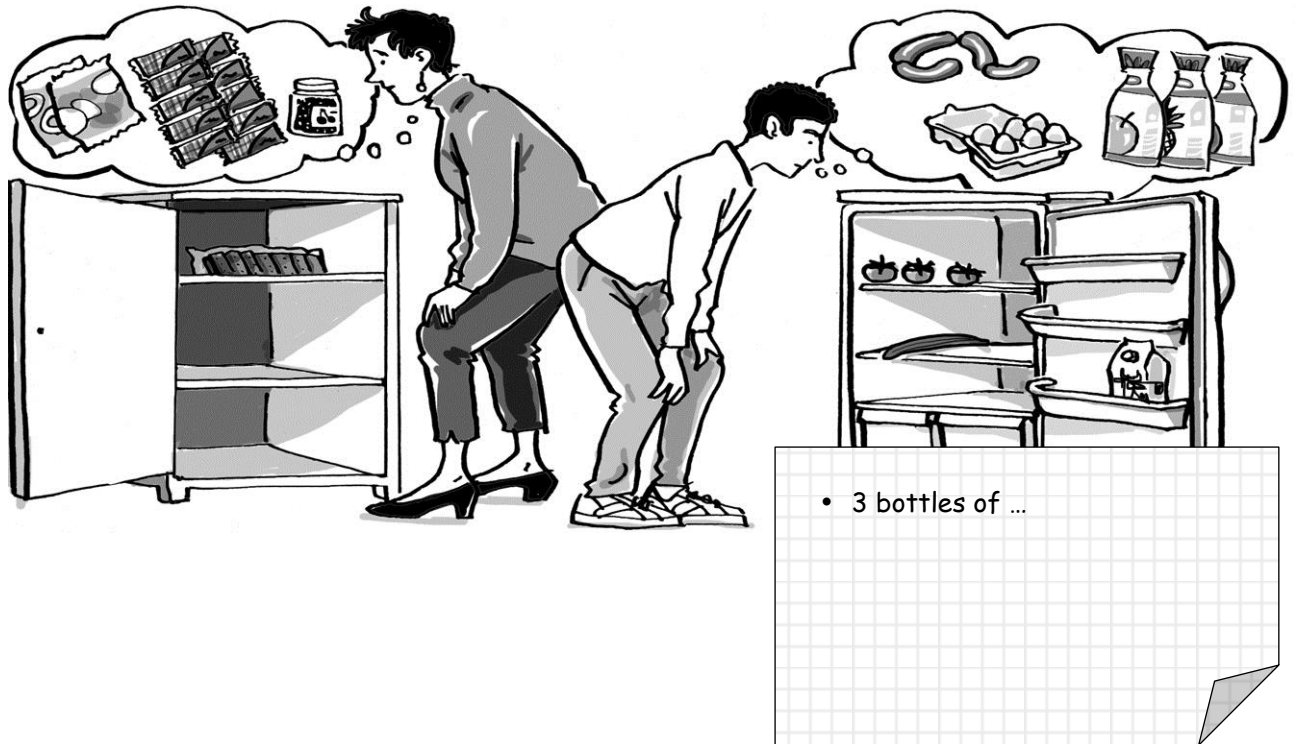
